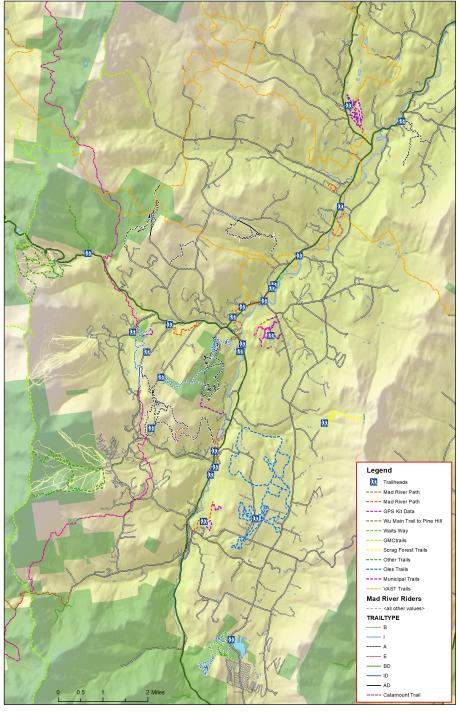

- Primary Market (Waitsfield, Warren & Fayston)

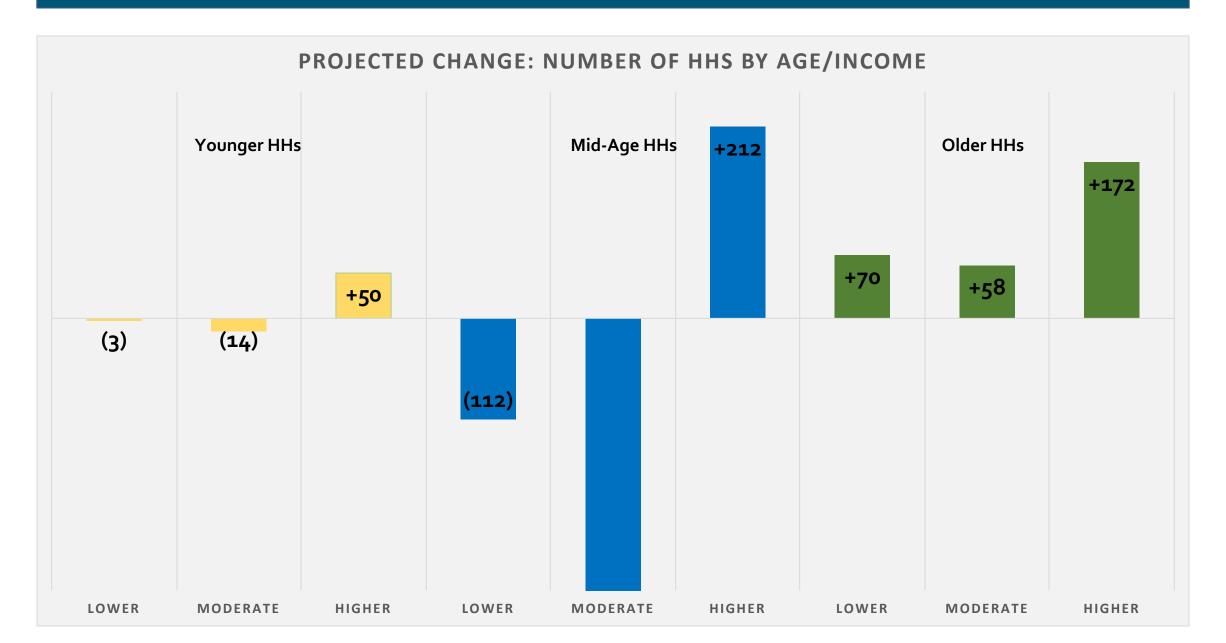

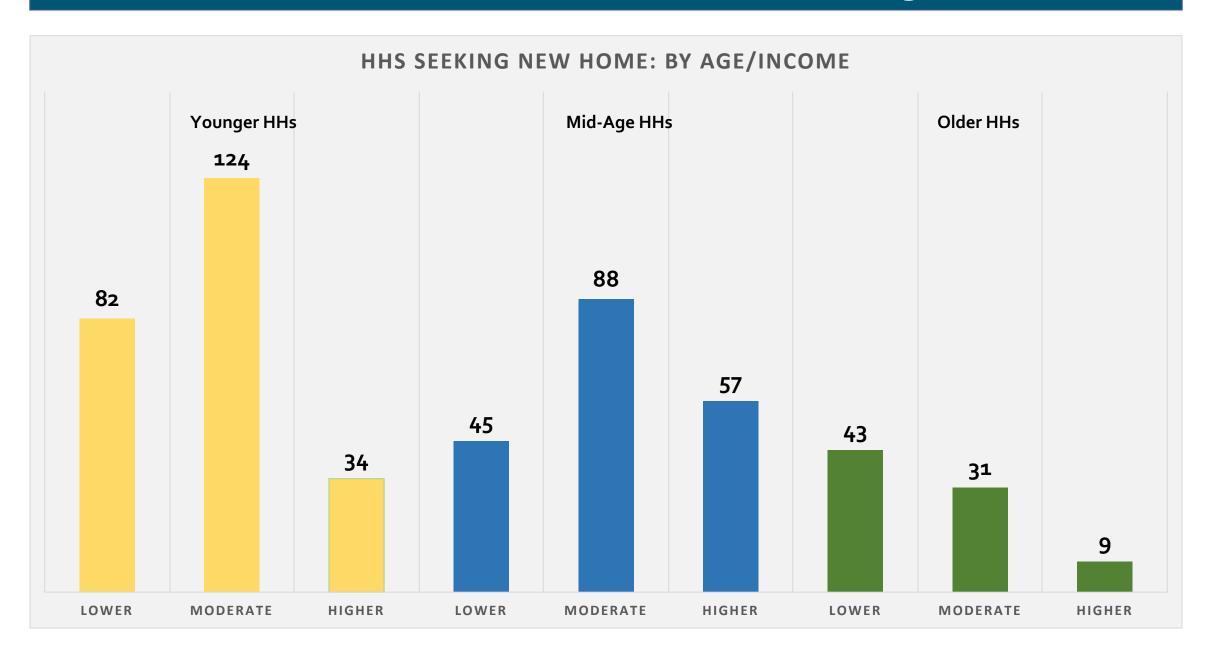

Employers have Strong Concerns Regarding Housing

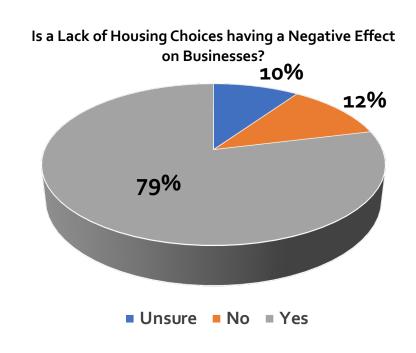
83% Say Lack of Housing has Effect on Ability to Hire

- Rental Housing Tax Credit w/some Subsidies if Available

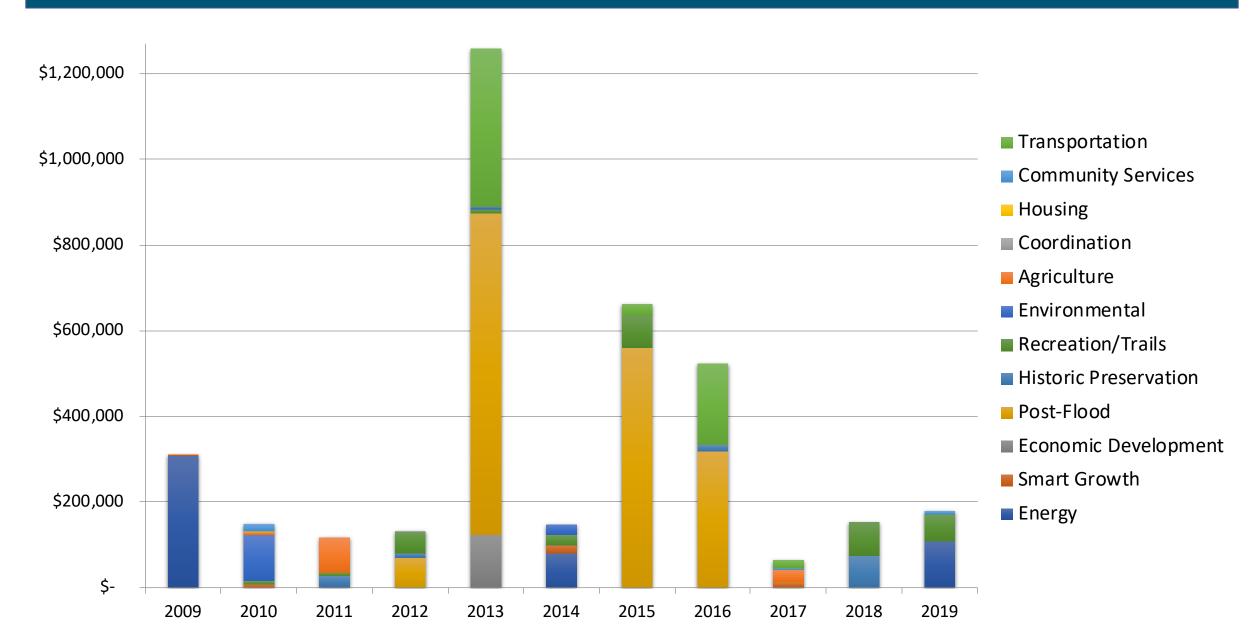
